Do Not Draft in R1: OT Trevor Penning

- Age 22 Height 6'7'' Weight 325
- Media Value: 10-20 (R1)
- Value: 65-80 (R3)
- Playstyle: Power
- Penning has perfect size and is super athletic. He is really strong and he shows his strength in the run game.
- Even though he is a power player, he gets pushed around in pass pro. He has bad feet, bad balance and tends to get over aggressive, or lets the rusher run into him. He has been labeled the nastiest player this year, but that comes with a cost. He consistently looks to throw someone down and neglects his technique or just misses the block.



Do Not Draft in R1: NT Jordan Davis

- Age 22 Height 6'6'' Weight 341
- Media Value: 10-25 (R1)
- Value: 35-55 (R2)
- Playstyle: Runstuffer
- Jordan Davis is an athletic freak. His Combine performance is historicly great. He is a great runstuffer with decent passrush ability.
- He was not able to play a lot of snaps. Even though he is a good player I don't see the crazy upside the media is seeing. NT are just not as valuable and you can usually get a decent one in R4-7.



Edge: George Karlaftis



- AGE 21 Height 6'4'' Weight 266
- Value: 7-15 (R1)
- Playstyle: Elite Power rusher
- Karlaftis combines his power with really good Hands. He sets OT's up with his power and wins with an easy swipe or swim move. Even if he is not winning the rep, he creates pressure by pushing the OT in the QBs lap. Tries to be too finesse sometimes.
- He gets handeled in the run game a little to much.
- perfect pairing with Odafe Oweh
- Floor: + Ceiling: ++



CB: Trent McDuffie

- AGE 21 Height 5'11'' Weight 193
- Value: 7-15 (R1)
- Playstyle: Allrounder: Outside, Nickel Man, Zone, 3Deep, Tampa
- Only concern is his height, other than being short (29 3/4" Arms), one of the cleanest Corners already
- In man coverage he always sticks to the WR and presses surprisingly good (for his size). In zone coverage he stays disciplined and is not fooled by zone beaters easily.
- Floor: + Ceiling: ++



Edge: Jermaine Johnson II

- Age 23 Height 6'5'' Weight 262
- Value: 15-25 (R1)
- Playstyle: Edgesetter
- Jermaine Johnson looks like a created player on Madden, he has ideal size (Arms 34'') for an Edgedefender and is a great athlete (4.51 40)
- He sets a good edge against the run and keeps his outside contain. On Passingdowns he shines with a combination of Speed to Power moves or just flies by the OT
- He has no elite trait
- Floor: o Ceiling: s



Center: T.Linderbaum

- AGE 22 Height 6'2'' Weight 296
- Value: 20-30 (R1)
- Playstyle: Zone
- Tyler Linderbaum is not a scheme fit and a little to "light" for a heavy/power run scheme. He makes up for it with perfect leverage and great technique. After combo blocks he gets quickly to the second level.
- Floor: ++ Ceiling: ++

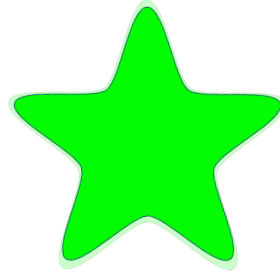


DT: Devonte Wyatt

- Age 24 Height 6'3'' Weight 304
- Value: 25-32(R1)
- Playstyle: RushDT
- Great hand usage, super quick for his size, always positions him well, good leverage, good power, great technique = this drafts best RushDT. Great Passrusher, good run defender. He poseses ideal size. No real weakness to his game.
- He profited from playing alongside the best DLineman in the Nation.
- Floor: + Ceiling: ++



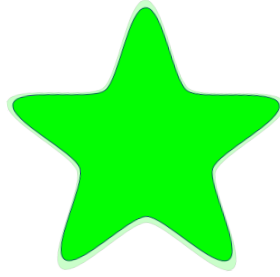
Edge: Josuha Paschal



- Age 22 Height 6'3'' **Weight 278**
- Value: 30-45 (R1-R2)
- Playstyle: Powerrusher
- Josuha Paschal is an underrated athlete. He ran a 4.77 40 while weighing 278 and had an 37.5 vert. He may be lacking top end speed but he is extremely **explosive**, which is far more important as an Edge.
- He is **not the greatest technician and lacks bend**. But he plays with **great leverage** and power. Paschal has a quick get off and shots his gap super fast. He **splits OLineman on run** plays consistently. Has inside outside versatility.
- Floor: o Ceiling: **++**



ILB: Leo Chenal



- Age 21 Height 6'3'' Weight 250
- Value: 35-45 (R2)
- Playstyle: Runstopper
- Big physical LB, with great speed (4.53) and explosivness (40.5 vertical 128 Broad jump). Gets lost in coverage sometimes. Tends to get sloppy with his technique. Leo Chenal is an elite runstopper, he can take on blocks, shed them or evade them with a quick swim move. He does not get fooled easily by counters and misdirections and packs a punch. Phenomenal Blitzer (Perfect scheme fit)

S/CB: Daxton Hill

- Age 21 Height 6'0'' Weight 191
- Value: 35-50 (R2)
- Playstyle: Nickel/ (Box)Safety- (Man)
- Daxton Hill is a **super fast (4.38 40) and quick athlete**. His **33.5 Vert** is disappointing. He **moves smoothly and sticks very well to the WRs hip pocket**. Hill uses **his long arms (32 1/4") with great timing to knock the ball away**. **Not an explosiv tackler and struggles taking on blocks. Not the best hands (dropped a few "should've been INTs")**. Some of his "big plays" develop because of bad offense, rather than him make a great play. Floor: o Ceiling: +



CB: Jalen Pitre

- Age 22 Height 5'11'' Weight 198
- Value: 35-50 (R2)
- Playstyle: Nickel/Box Safety
- The Ravens are strong at outside Corner with M.Humphrey and M.Peters, but are lacking a good Nickel. Pitre is the **best pure Nickel** in this years draft. He is quick in reading route combinations and jumping the route. He is a good tackler.
- Floor: 0 Ceiling: +



CB: Rodger McCreary

- Age 22 Height 5'11'' Weight 190
- Value: 45-60 (R2)
- Playstyle: Man, Nickel
- McCreary plays **really smooth and still aggressive**. He does **not allow much separation** in man and even if he gets caught on, he is close enough to tackle immediately.
- **Size is a big concern (28 7/8" arms)** if he plays as an outside CB, but he showed enough **promise inside and outside**.
- Floor: - Ceiling: ++

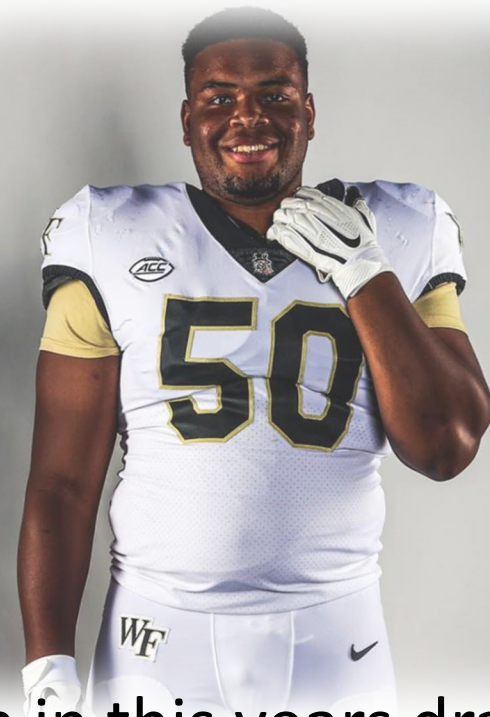


OT: Zach Tom



- Age 23 Height 6'5'' Weight 295
- Value: 60- 80 (R2-3)
- Playstyle: Finesse
- Zach Tom is one of the most athletic Olineman in this years draft. His mirroring ability is off the charts. He has good mesurables and versitality to play all over the line. Tom's technic is not perfect but very clean. Only concern is that he lacks power/strength, which could be an issue at the next level. Should be a tad more aggressiv in the run game.
- He held top 15 edge prospect Jermaine Johnson to zero pressures.

OT/OG: Luke Goedeke

- Age 23 Height 6'5'' Weight 310
- Value: 70-85 (R3)
- Playstyle: Runblocker
- Only because of his arm length (32 1/4") he probably will end up at OG in the NFL.
- Luke is a premier runblocker, with great leverage and hand placement (on run plays). He climbs to the second level quickly after double teams.
- In Pass Pro he struggles with technique (feet are all over the place) and is over aggressive.
- Floor: - Ceiling: +



CB: Marcus Jones

- Age 23 Height 5'8'' Weight 174
- Value: 70-95 (R3)
- Playstyle: Nickel
- Marcus Jones is a **small Corner (28 7/8" arms)**, who is limited to playing Nickel. But he is pretty good at that and can be an **immediat starter**. He is **fast twitchy versatile and explosiv**, which allows him to **hit top speed immediatly**. He has **smooth hips**, making his **change of direction fast and fluent**. If not for the **size concerns**, he **would be the #1 CB** this year. For a 3rd round pick great value.

OT/OG: Darian Kinnard

- Age 22 Height 6'5'' Weight 322
- Value: 75-100 (R3)
- Playstyle: Runblocker
- Kinnard may **not be the most explosiv or technical** player, but he is a constant "**man-mover**" in the run game. He is solid in pass pro. He will move to Guard in the NFL. But with ideal size (**35'' arms**) he has a chance to move back to Tackle after a few years with NFL coaching.
- Floor: o Ceiling: +



Edge: Kingsley Enagbare

- Age 22 Height 6'4'' Weight 258
- Value: 75-105 (R3)
- Playstyle: Power rusher
- Enagbare is a powerful rusher with long arms (34 3/4") and strong hands, which is a deadly combination. He will wear down Tackles over the course of a game. He lacks bend, explosiveness and a rushing plan and will probably never have a lot of sacks, but pushing Tackles into the QB's lap will result in a few overthrown throws.
- 2021 Pass rush win rate: 40% next closes Aidan Hutchinson 33%
- Floor: - Ceiling: +



WR: Alec Pierce

- Age 21 Height 6'3'' Weight 211
- Value: 80- 105 (R3)
- Playstyle: Deep Threat
- Alec Pierce has perfect size and elite athleticism (4.41 40/ 40.5 Vert). He is a decent route runner and knows how to set DBs up, to get deep on them. He lacks release and quickness and struggles against press. Pierce needs a ton of work to be a complete WR but has the traits to become one.

WR: Danny Grey

- Age 23 Height 6'0'' Weight 186
- Value: 85-105 (R3)
- Playstyle: Deep Threat
- Danny Grey ran a 4.33 forty and he shows that speed on tape. He consistently runs away from defenders and is a threat to score on every catch. He has a quick release but needs more polish on his release and his routes. He tends to have concentration drops.
- A slightly bigger, but a little more unpolished version of Hollywood Brown.
- Floor: - Ceiling: ++



CB: Damarri Mathis

- Age 23 Height 5'11'' Weight 196
- Value: 85-105 (R3)
- Playstyle: Man
- Damarri Mathis is an uber aggressive man cover CB, with elite athleticism (4.39 40/ 43,5 vert). Even though he ran a 4.39 forty, he does not allways show that speed on tape. He lacks poise to play deep zone, which leads to him panicing, resulting in penaltys.
- If NFL coaching can clean up his sloppyness, he can easily become an above average starter.
- Floor: -- Ceiling: ++



TE: Jeremy Ruckert

- Age 21 Height 6'5'' Weight 250
- Value: 95-110 (R3-4)
- Playstyle: Blocking
- Ruckert is by far the best blocking TE in this years draft. He has good hand placement and is strong. Jeremy Ruckert is an underrated route runner and pass catcher. He has super reliable Hands.
- He deals with a foot injury, but is expected to be healthy when training camp starts.
- Floor: + Ceiling: +



CB: Zyon McCollum

- Age 22-23 ? Height 6'4'' Weight 200
- Value: 105-130 (R4)
- Playstyle: Outside
- Zyon McCollum is a hyper athletic CB (4.33 40, 39.5 vert, 6.48 3cone) with ideal size for an outside Corner. He plays with bad technique, but taking a shot at a player with so much potential physical upside in the 4th feels justified.

DT: E.Uwazurike

- Age 23 Height 6'6" Weighth 316
 - Value: 105-130 (R4)
 - Playstyle: Power
 - Eyima Uwazurike poseses a good combination of size and length (35 1/8" arms). He is very explosiv (33 vert), but he has an inconsistent get off. He punishes OL with power and a rare hand swipe. Uwazurike tends to get to high to fast, resulting in him getting outleveraged. But when he plays disciplined he is a rock solid runstoper and decent enough pass rusher to be a 3down player. He as experience all over the line, even at Edge.

Edge: Alex Wright

- Age 22? Height 6'7'' Weight 270
- Value: 110- 130 (R4)
- Playstyle: 3-4 DE
- Alex Wright is a huge specimen. He shows explosive get off and strong hands. His power overwhelms OT's consistently. (Div II).
- Wright lacks a pass rush plan and shows no bend. You need to bank on his physicality and that NFL coaching will form him into a decent technician.

OT: Daniel Faalele

- Age 22 Height 6'8'' Weight 384
- Value: 115- 143 (R4)
- Playstyle: Runblocker
- Daniel Faalele is a GIANT. He shows power and explosivness on run plays. He consistently overpowers De/DT, but he leans forward to much, losing balance -> blocks get shed easily. On passing plays he has an suprisingly quick first step. Because of his height, he plays too high. Which leads to him getting out leveraged, resulting in beeing pushed back, eventough he is the stronger player.

NT: Neil Farrell Jr.

- Age 23 Height 6'4'' Weight 330
- Value 125-140 (R4)
- Playstyle: Runstuffer
- Neil Farrell Jr. is a strong NT, with a **violent** (sometimes **unprecise**) **hand swipe**. He has **good hand placement on bullrushes**. He tries to get **too cute sometimes (spin moves, dips)**. Farrell Jr. is a **good runstuffer** and gets rarely moved backwards. **Bad lateral speed**.
- He is rather "**Fat**" than strong and definitely needs to change that.

WR: Tayquon Thornton

- Age 22 Height 6'3'' Weight **182**
- Value: 150-175 (R5)
- Playstyle: Gadget/Deep threat
- Tayquon Thornton is the **fastest player in this years Draft (4.28 40)**. After the catch he can run away from almost everybody. He **cant get off press coverage and runs very lazy short/medium routes**. His Route running and release are underwhelming.
- I think you can bank on his upside with a 5th round pick and he could eventually be a Hollywood replacement if Hollywood demands to much.

Edge: Christopher Allen

- Age 23-24? Height 6'4'' Weight 242
- Value: 180-200 (R6)
- Playstyle: Edge Setter
- When healthy Chris Allen was a **very good and productive edge setter**. He showed flashes of getting to the QB too. He **poses an ideal edge frame (33'' arms)**.
- Biggest question is his **injury history**. He is a **low floor** (maybe he cant even get back to speed) high ceiling (decent starter) kind of player and I think round 6 is a great place to pick him.

Center: Doug Kramer

- Age 24? Height 6'2'' Weight 299
- Value: 180-210 (R6)
- Playstyle: Zone
- Doug Kramer shows flashes of good pass pro. He tends to play to high, which leaves his chest vulnerable. Eventough he works his double team well in run plays, he struggles trying to climb up to the 2nd level. Not because he lacks athleticism, but proper timing and technique.
- With some work he could be a decent back up.
- Floor: - Ceiling: o



OG: William Dunkle

- Age 22 Height 6'5'' Weight 328
- Value: 190-221 (R6)
- Playstyle: Runblocker
- William Dunkle is big physical run blocker with good measurables (33 5/8" arms). He allways generates push back, when he makes contact. But he leans forward to much, making it easy to shed or avoid his block completly. Dunkle has problems in pass pro with simple stunts and rushers that have decent hands. In todays passing league, it would be hart for him to be a starter, but the Ravens unique offense fits his skill set perfectly fine.
